In our program you will receive college credit with hands on experience. Our students put their skills learned in the classroom to use, working on a professional production side-by-side with mentors and production staff members.

Student positions are available in all Production departments. Members of the Cabrillo Stage production staff provide individual mentoring and training needed for the tasks at hand. Students can receive written evaluations and/or recommendations, which can provide professional experience for a resume, as well as, great letters of recommendations for Universities and Colleges through out the country.

WORK WITHIN THE PRODUCTION DEPARTMENTS

SCENIC INTERNS: Gain Experience with power/hand tools and ability to read blue prints. Work side by side with professional Technical Directors, Carpenters & Welders as you build the scenic elements to one of our productions. Learn the art of scenic construction and execution.

SCENIC PAINTING INTERNS: Gain some experience in the art of scenic painting. Work along side Scenic Designers and Paint Charge artist as the artistic vision of the productions come to life.

PROP INTERNS: Learn the art of property design and construction from the ground up. Evaluate the prop needs of the script. Work with Designers to design, locate and or build the hand props within the production.

COSTUME INTERNS: Learn basic hand and machine sewing skills. Work along side professional costume designers and stitchers as the creative process from the Director to Designer to stage unfold over the build process of the production. Work with the actors to coordinate quick changes required within the production as well as assist in maintaining the look of each costume through out the run.

BACK STAGE CREW: There is nothing more exciting then working backstage on a large musical production. Be instrumental in creating the magic that only happens on stage as the sets shift from one look to another. Work along side our Production Stage Manager & Directors to evaluate the scenic elements to create all of the scenic shifts. Work along side the actors within the production.

LIGHT & SOUND BOARD OPERATORS: Learn to operate state of the art computer controlled ETC lighting or sound equipment. Work with the Master Electrician or Sound Designer in programing and running each performance.

SPOT LIGHT OPERATORS: Create the focus of the show, by operating one of several spot lights during the production. Gain experience on a multiple level of lighting aspects in how the visuals of a show are put together.

ELECTRICIANS: Get-hands on experience in reading professional lighting plots, hanging, focusing and adding color to the lighting instruments in large musical productions.

ELIGIBILITY: Our program is intended for applicants that are currently attending High School or College. Others within our community are always welcome to join us as well. We will expect professional work habits and a high level of commitment and responsibility from our student interns. All students, recent graduates and career changers with an enthusiasm and love for the performing arts should apply. No experience is necessary. We will work with you to find the best suited position that reflects your interest and experience.

WORK HOURS: The hours of our Interns vary depending in which department you choose to work in and how many college credits you wish to obtain. Keep in mind for high school students, your college credits can be transferred to high school credits if you choose to do that. See your guidance counselor for details. Currently 3 college credits is equal to 10 high school credits. Interns assigned to running the production will have weekend and evening hours. Please see the table below as a reference guide to hours worked related to college credits earned. Keep in mind if your schedule differs, we will try and work with you.
